

Annex: Examples of When Excluded Persons Would Be Liable for an Offence for Entering the Casinos

1. An excluded person was informed of his exclusion status via courier delivery, and ought reasonably to know when he becomes an excluded person. He would be liable for an offence if he enters the casinos.
2. An excluded person is aware of his visit limit, but entered the casino in breach of his visit limit, claiming to have miscalculated his prior visits. He ought reasonably to know when he had exceeded his visit limit, and would be liable for an offence for entering the casinos.
